

Ted Ellison Bassett, 76; of Soda Springs passed away on Saturday, January 1, 2022.

Ted Bassett was born on September 8, 1945 to Loran and Helen Bassett and was the fifth of their ten children. He made his home, and raised his family in Soda Springs, Idaho and loved living in this community.

Ted was a deeply spiritual man with a strong personal relationship with Jesus Christ. He enjoyed sharing his faith with his family and friends.

Ted married Judy Ann Gagon October 23, 1965 in Pocatello, Idaho.

In the early 70's, Ted started his first company Bassett Building, and began working in construction and carpentry. He worked at Gagon Lumber with his father-in-law, Mutt Gagon, for several years, and also worked 20 years as an in-plant contractor at Monsanto. While at Monsanto, he designed and constructed the kiln roof cover and countless other projects.

In 1994, Ted and Judy opened Bassett Building & Supply where he offered their customers advice and consulting on projects both large and small. Over the years, he made many substantial structural contributions to Caribou County including the Soda Springs City Park Pavilion, the restrooms at the County Fairgrounds, and many more. Ted was proud not only for the services and products the business offers, but also for the friendly, social atmosphere it creates.

In his younger days, he and a few close friends formed a band called The Gretions, later known as Friday's Children. They performed many shows in many states, including Sioux City, Iowa; Sun Valley, Idaho, and Salt Lake City, Utah. They performed at many local dances and events. This sparked a love for music throughout his family which continues today.

Some of his hobbies and interests included spending time with his family, shooting, reloading, hunting, fishing, cooking and grilling, playing and listening to music and anything MOPAR. Ted had a never-ending passion for reading, studying and constant learning. Sought by many, his help and knowledge were shared willingly.

Ted is survived by his wife of 56 years, Judy Bassett, his sons Spencer (Jenny) Bassett, David Campbell, Tyler (Christina) Hansen; daughters Robin

(Jon) Tabor, Wendy Bassett, Jamie Bassett. 18 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren. Brothers Curtis King Bassett and Boyd Shuell Bassett. He is preceded in death by his parents Loran and Helen Bassett; Sisters Wendy, Beverly, Connie, Jeraldine; Brothers Lavelle, Alvin, Dee, and Grandson Taylor Bassett.



Lurgan Doctor Weds: Belfast Ceremony
Bassett Moore Bridal
Shell-Pink Satin Dress
The Reception

The wedding of Miss Evelyn Georgiana Mai Moore and Mr. William Waring Bassett, M.B., F.R.C.S., the Manor House, Lurgan Co. Armagh, was solemnized on Saturday at St. John's Church, Malone, Belfast. The bride is the second daughter of Mr. and Mrs. J. Yeates Moore, Drumbad, Deramore Park, Belfast, and is related to the well-known author, poet and dramatist, Mr. W.B. Yeats. The bridegroom, who is senior medical officer of Lurgan and Portadown District Hospital, is the only son of the late Mr. John Waring Bassett, Churchill, Newcastle, and of Mrs. Bassett, 20, Osborne Park, Belfast.

The church had been effectively decorated for the occasion with tulips and palms. Mr. Steele presided at the organ and the service was fully choral. The officiating clergy were Rev. F.H.P. L'Estrange (St. John's, Malone) and the Rev. Henry O'Connor, M.B.E (Dundrum, Co. Down).

The bride, who was given away by her father, wore a gown of shell-pink satin arranged on sheath lines and ornamented with pearls. The long tulle veil was held in place with a plaited headdress, and she carried a sheaf of

Orphelia roses, the gift of the bridegroom.

There were two bridesmaids - Miss Kathleen Clarke (cousin of bride) and Miss Violet Gardiner, and the matron of honour was Mrs. S. Stewart. They made quite a picture in their period frocks of silver lame, the neckline finished at the back with medici collars and the skirts terminating with short trains. On their heads they wore pearl Juliet caps and carried sheafs of pink tulips, which were the gifts of the bridegroom. Their only ornaments were pearl necklaces, which were also the bridegroom's gifts.

Mr. F.I. M'Clure, PRCS, MCOG., Belfast, acted as best man.

THE RECEPTION

Afterwards a reception was held at the bride's home, where the guests were received by Mr. and Mrs. Moore. Mrs. Moore (bride's mother) wore a two-piece silk suit of moss green, with a brown hat. She carried a bouquet of roses.

Mrs. Bassett (bridegroom's mother) was wearing an ensemble of black silk with a large black hat. Her bouquet was composed of pink flowers. Mrs. Dermot Johnston (sister of bride) was in beige with hat to match, and Miss Patricia Moore (sister of the bride) wore a two-piece suit of duck egg blue and a brown hat.

Sir Dawson and Lady Bates were present.

After the bride had cut her wedding cake Mr. Johnston (Lisburn) proposed the toast of bride and bridegroom. This was replied to by Mr. Bassett, who toasted the bridesmaids, which was replied to on their behalf by Mr. M'Clure. Sir Dawson Bates also suitably proposed the toast of the bride's father and mother.

When leaving for the honeymoon, which is being spent in London and Paris, Mrs. Bassett wore a two-piece suit of Lido blue trimmed with white ermine. The hat was to correspond.

The excellent catering was in the hands of the Ulster Menu Co., who were also responsible for the wedding cake. The red maize at the church, the awning, and the large marquee which was erected in the garden at the home were also supplied by this firm.
