
## Section 3 - Featured Bassett: World War II Foot Locker of Col. R.W. Bassett of Ohio

Michael Wallace Bassett, 49, died October 9 in Ladson, South Carolina. He was preceded in death by his parents Frederick William Bassett and Peggy Roberts Bassett.

Michael was a poet, visual artist, scholar, and teacher. He earned a B.A. from Wofford College with a double major in philosophy and religion, an MFA in creative writing from Vermont College, and a Ph.D. in creative writing from the University of Southern Mississippi. He taught English and creative writing for 25 years at various institutions, including LaGrange Academy, North Broward Preparatory School, his alma mater Hilton Head Preparatory School, and Timberland High School. He was a dedicated teacher who inspired students with his love of language and passion for ideas. He was also a generous and nurturing person who genuinely cared for his students and wanted them to feel safe and valued.

Michael was an accomplished poet and a previous winner of the Fugue Poetry Contest and the Joan Johnson Award. His poems have appeared in numerous journals and anthologies. He also published three chapbooks: Karma Puppets, A Train Dreams of When it was a Killer Whale and More Exhibits from the Museum of Other, and Waiting for Love to Make My Phone Explode, as well as one full-length book of poetry, Hatchery of Tongues, and a children's book, Batrocks and Greenie.




A memorial service will be held at a later date.

# Slim Bassett dies in Oregon

Former Jackson resident Grover Cleveland "Slim" Bassett died in Medford, Ore., on April 17. He was 90.

Mr. Bassett was born at Union, Miss., on Nov. 4, 1892. In 1916 Mr. Bassett came into Jackson Hole via the Berry Creek freight road from St. Anthony's, Idaho. During the 53 years he spent in Teton County, Mr. Bassett worked for the McBrides, Lee Lucas and on the Hatchet Ranch.

Eventually, Mr. Bassett homesteaded 60 acres on Aspen Drive below Snow King Mountain. In 1936 he bought the Granite (Hot Springs) Ranch. He sold the ranch to Dr. Donald MacLeed in 1965, but continued to live in a cabin on the property until 1969 when he moved to Oregon.

In 1920 he married Mabel Fuller at Driggs, Idaho. She preceded him in death on July 15, 1965.

Survivors include one son, Grover J. Bassett in Applegate, Ore.; a step-daughter, Margaret O. Bell in Salt Lake City; a stepson, Arthur J. Rutherford in Virginia; a sister, Annie Hanson in Louisiana; six grand-children, and several great grand-children.

Funeral services are at 2 p.m. today at the LDS Chapel in Jackson. Burial follows at South Park Cemetery.



On October 11, 1958, Dean was united in marriage to Sharon L. Osberg in South Dakota. The couple resided in Fairmont. In fact, Dean was born in his house and where he lived his entire life! This union was blessed with four children, Brian, Allan, Lisa, and Mark. Dean and Sharon shared over 65 years together.

Dean worked for many years as a lineman for the Fairmont Power Plant. He was a proud member of the Fairmont Fire Department, serving for 20 years before his retirement. He was a long-time member of St. Paul Lutheran Church where he was continually active, having held several positions in the church over the years.

He brightened our world and will be missed greatly.
