# Who Were Your Ancestors?

Perhaps you cannot name them beyond your grandparents. Possibly you have heretofore been indifferent as to your ancestors — their names, their families, where they came from and where they went to, what they did in life, when and where they were born, married, lived and died.

Considering all that had to happen before we could be born, we surely can spend a little time to collect the records of those who helped to make us what we are.

A genealogy at best can give but a meagre reference to each individual, but its preparation will often cause the saving of records which otherwise may be scattered or lost, not only to us but to all the generations to come.

Such records can only be collected while they are available and made complete before the passing of parents or others having knowledge of missing details. Even if you personally are not interested, your children or other relatives will be sooner or later and any break in the chain prevents the identification of many records in the future.

## BASSETT GENEALOGY

The above "Family History" has been in preparation since 1884, but has never been completed and each succeeding year the task becomes more difficult. We owe more to our ancestors than we could ever repay. The least we can do is to collect our family records while we can and list them in their correct order of descent.

The undersigned has records and notes on over 25,000 individual BASSETTS and about half have been assigned to their proper line. The others have not so far been identified due to lack of necessary information.

Won't you please help to complete the record by reporting the full names of your BASSETT parents and grand-parents, the exact date and place of their birth, marriage and death and the same details for each one of your Father BASSETT'S children and their families? Any additional details as to occupation, civic and military services, organization memberships, etc. are desired.

If your family records are incomplete, won't you please pass this card along so there may be a full report of your line. Your assistance in making the record complete is very earnestly requested. Send all you have and search for more.

Searsport - Eben Pierce Bassett, 84, died Saturday evening at a Belfast hospital following a long illness.

He was born at Providence, R.I., August 18, 1876, son of Alpheus and

Elizabeth (Lane) Bassett.

He was a graduate of the University of Maine in 1899 as an electrical engineer. He was a second lieutenant in Coburn Ports Corps, ROTC. He worked for General Electric Company at New York until 1929, when he retired. Following his retirement he lived at Bayside for many years. He moved to Searsport seven years ago.

He died research for the Penobscot Marine Museum on ships and sea captains. He was a member of the New England Genealogical Society and the American Genealogical Society. He compiled the Bassett genealogy.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Elizabeth P. Bassett, of Searsport; a cousin, Albert Pierce of Bangor.

Funeral services will be at the First Congregational Church of Searsport Tuesday at 1 p.m. Robert Sargent will officiate.

Interment will be in Mt. Hope Cemetery, Bangor.

John Bassett was living on the Yakima Indian reservation for the 1930 census. I have not yet found his parents or how he picked up the Bassett surname.

Yakima Herald-Republic, Washington, 19 Dec 1998 Wapt Bassett

Wapato. He owned and operated Yakama Indian Contractors. Survivors include three daughters, Pamela Bassett, Elena Bassett and Mary Anne Bassett Washines, all of Wapato; a son, Martin L. Bassett of Wapato; five grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. Dressing services were held at the family home Friday morning and he was moved to the Satus Longhouse for

overnight services. Military honors were to be conducted by the Wapato American Legion at sunrise today in the Union Gap Cemetery. Merritt Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

On Friday, Dec. 29, 2023, Charlie, 81, of Grand Haven, transitioned peacefully into the next phase of eternal life. Residing in Michigan his entire life, Charlie was a Hastings High State Champion in wrestling and All-State Honorable Mention center in football. He earned a bachelor's degree and two master's degrees from Western Michigan University and completed all coursework for a PhD at Michigan State University.

Charlie taught Industrial Arts for 36 years at Spring Lake High School and coached boys and girls tennis for 44 years. He often declared that he never worked a day in his life - it was a privilege, and he enjoyed the subjects, sports, students, players and parents.

Charlie promoted the sport of high school tennis in Michigan, serving in many capacities on several boards and earned accolades from his peers: named Tennis Coach of the Year 5 times and State Coach of the Year 3 times, inducted into Michigan High School Tennis Coaches Association Hall of Fame ('92), Michigan High School Coaches Hall of Fame and Spring Lake High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

Many of his tennis players and students have said that he did not merely teach woodshop or tennis, but taught life and was a true mentor of the positive. Whether you knew him as Chuck, Mr. B., Coach, photographer, woodworker, husband, father, or friend, you found him always patient and kind. The mantra he taught and lived by is "the body moves in the direction of the most dominant thought." He was a student of a course in miracles and truly affirmed the Christ in each and every person, extending love to all. He is survived by his wife, Mary Jo; son, Chad (Bob); brother, Robert; stepchildren, Tess (Andy) and Andrew (Nicola); three grandchildren and many cousins, nieces, and nephews. He was preceded in death by his first wife, Barbara (neé Beck).

A celebration of the life of this wonderful man will be held at a later date

and there will be pie because he always said, "The best pie is more pie." Memorial contributions may be made to the Charles (Charlie) A. Bassett Endowed Scholarship Fund at Grand Haven Area Community Foundation. This fund was created in honor of Charlie in 2007 by tennis players and parents.
